C.H.A.T. Launch Event

C.H.A.T. was officially launched in Glasgow on 7th June 2016. The event was opened by Alison Douglas, Chief Executive of Alcohol Focus Scotland, followed by Jane Wilson, Senior Learning & Development Officer at Alcohol Focus Scotland who told "the story of C.H.A.T. so far...". Karen Campbell and May Rookes from Time 4 Us in Alloa and Graham Wordie from DAPL in Fife shared their experience of taking part in the C.H.A.T. community pilot and of told us how they used the resource in their daily work.





What Would You Do?
Now available!*

Development of our A.D.A.M. Online resources is now complete and available to C.H.A.T. Members.

Based on Adam and Megan's characters the new resources use comic book style graphics to explore different situations which young people

may face as a result of alcohol asking them "What would you do?"

Each question has choices which have implications for the characters.

Adam's first scenario is how to respond to his brother Dan when he has been drinking and becomes aggressive.

The second scenario explores Adam's feelings about going to visit Dan in prison.



Megan's is invited out with her friends. When she gets there she realises they are drinking. What should she do?

The second scenario Megan faces is when she has to go and live with her Gran when her Mum goes into recovery.
